

# Somalia Rainfall Forecast

The three days cumulated rainfall forecast (Map 1) is pointing towards light rains in scattered places across the country with Puntland expected to remain dry within the three days. Rainfall activities are expected to increase as seen in the one week forecast (Map 2) towards the end of the week especially in Southern and central parts of Somalia and the upper parts of the Juba and Shabelle basins within the Ethiopian highlands.

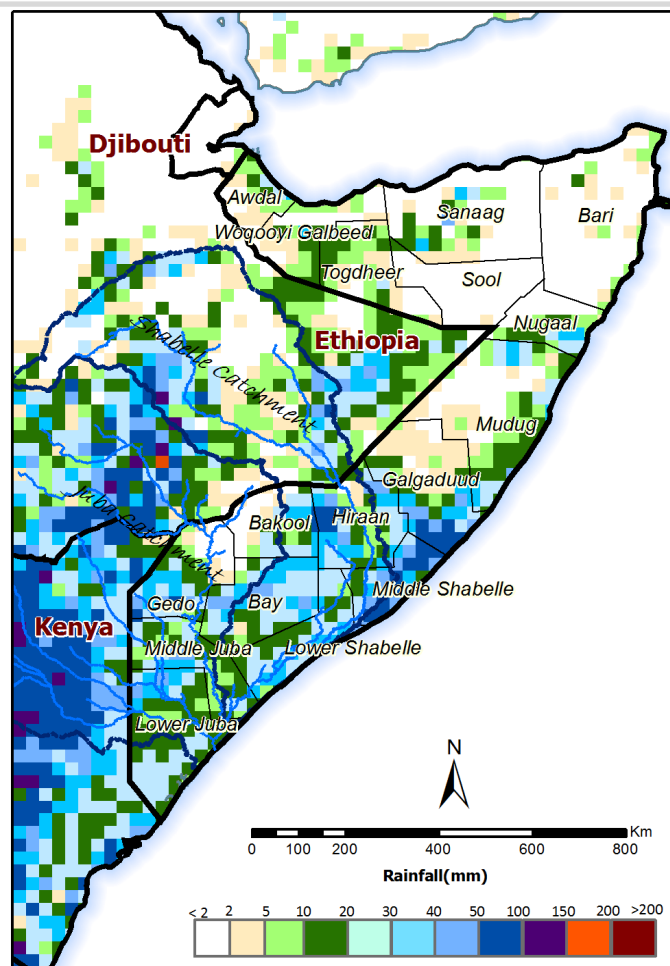
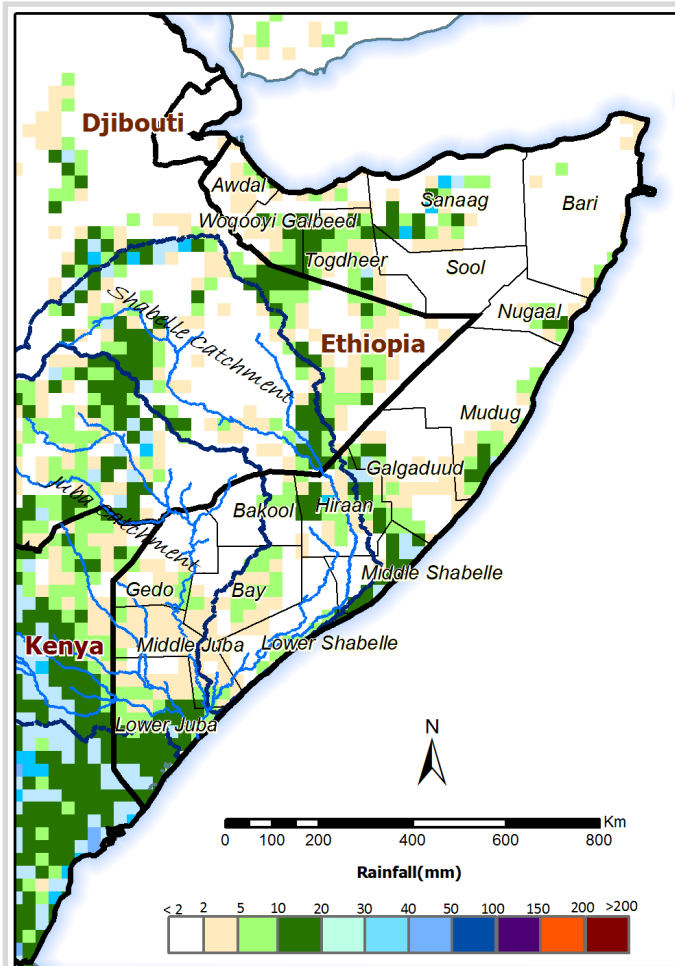
Hot and dry conditions remain a concern in Somaliland and Puntland with the rainy season coming to an end.

River levels along the Juba and Shabelle basins remain within the normal ranges with no risk of flooding given the rainfall forecast.

Users are advised that this is a forecast and at times there may be discrepancies between forecast and actual amounts of rainfall received. The forecast, observed river levels and rainfall amounts are updated on a daily basis and can be found on this link: <http://frrims.faoswalim.org>
